## Longhorn Pride

- Students must have a grade of 75 or better in each subject.
- Students may have no more than two excused absences in any class per six weeks. An unexcused absence exempts you from Longhorn Pride for the six weeks.
- Six tardies total in a six weeks exempts you from Longhorn Pride. This includes tardies given at morning assembly.
- Students may have no more than one referral to the principal's office for disciplinary reasons. There is also a yearly limit of no more than three referrals.
- Three days (consecutive or nonconsecutive) in lunch detention is equal to one office referral.
- Students who qualify each six weeks are entitled to various rewards, privileges, and activities throughout the next reporting period.
- Students who qualify four out of five six weeks reporting periods and have completed ten hours of program participation and community service hours will be eligible for an extended year-end trip.
- Students who have maintained a 70 average and met program participation and community service hour requirements will be eligible for a year-end day trip.
- To qualify for the year-end day trip or year-end extended trip, students must perform four hours of program participation service through the Fall Festival. Three hours will be awarded for attending the school-wide trip to gather donations. The other hour may be awarded for addressing, and stuffing business letters, setup or clean up of the auction, or writing thank you cards to businesses that donated.
- To qualify for the year-end day trip or year-end extended trip, students must perform four hours of program participation service through the Three on Three Tournament.
- To qualify for the year-end day trip or year-end extended trip, students must perform two hours of discretionary community service. To be awarded those hours, students must present a note signed by the person for whom the service was performed. This cannot be a parent or family member.
- Students must be enrolled in at least 5 courses for each semester.
- NOTE: The Longhorn Pride Committee acknowledges that extenuating circumstances may prohibit a student from qualifying for Longhorn Pride in a particular six weeks grading period, and may thereby affect that student's qualification for the year-end trip. The committee has the authority to review students' circumstances on a case-by-case basis to determine whether a disqualification should be overturned.

## **Longhorn Pride Junior High**

- Requirements for junior high students are the same as high school students, with the following exceptions:
  - JH students are required to complete only the three program participation hours that are to be earned by attending the school-wide trip to gather donations.
  - JH students are required to complete only one program participation hour at the Three on Three Tournament.
  - JH students are required to complete only one hour of discretionary community service.
- Junior high students are not eligible for the year-end extended trip, but will go on a year-end day trip.

## **COURSE CREDIT**

**Beginning with 9<sup>th</sup> graders in 2011-2012**, all high school students will be required to take End of Course exams in the following courses:

- Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry
- English I, English II, and English III
- Biology, Chemistry, and Physics
- World Geometry, World History, US History

# Student Conduct and Dress

## Disruptions in the Classroom

### Disciplinary Protocol:

- Teachers will follow a consistent protocol for handling classroom disruptions:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> offense: An extra, but meaningful assignment will be assigned, to be turned in the following day.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: The classroom teacher will send a note home to parents.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: The classroom teacher will call the student's parents.
  - 4<sup>th</sup> offense: The teacher will assign the student to Saturday School.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> offense: The student will be referred to the Principal's Office.
  - The principal will determine the subsequent disciplinary action, which may include corporal punishment, in school suspension, or placement in DAEP.
- Each step of the protocol will be documented by sending a disciplinary referral form home with the student.

## **DRESS AND GROOMING**

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

### **JH/HS Dress Code:**

- Dress and grooming shall not lead officials to believe that such dress or grooming will disrupt, interfere with, disturb, or distract from school activities. (Examples are listed below, but are not limited to the examples.)
- Shoes must be worn at all times. Students will be asked to wear closed toed shoes for lab settings such as Science, Woodworking and Agriculture classes.
- No pajamas worn to school except during approved events.
- No see-through blouses or jerseys, midriffs or cutoff shirts, halter tops or spaghetti straps are to be worn. Shirts and blouses must be buttoned. Undergarments cannot be exposed. Clothing must fit loosely enough to facilitate free movement and modest appearance. Girls' dresses or shorts must extend an inch below their middle finger of their arm as they are relaxed and hanging down by their side.
- Boys may not wear earrings at any school sponsored event or activity.
- No body piercing of any kind other than earrings on girls.
- All inappropriate jewelry will be confiscated by the principal or teacher.
- Hair that is considered unacceptable, distracting, disruptive, or a health-safety hazard is not allowed.

- Boys' hair must be clean, neat, off the collar and out of the eyes. Sideburns are not to extend below earlobe. Boys need to be clean shaven. All students' hair is not to be distracting in style or Color. (Ex. No Mohawk, spikes, multicolor, unnatural colors, and streaks etc. Natural colors are black, brown, red, blonde.)
- Gang related dress or symbols will not be allowed during school activities.
- School logos or sports wear other than that representing Lazbuddie Longhorns will be discouraged.
- No sags. Pants must be pulled up around hips. Length not to exceed the heel of the shoe. Crotch cannot hang below mid-thigh. Boys' shirttails must be tucked into trousers.
- Sleeveless shirts must be 3 inches wide at shoulders.
- Overalls may be worn properly. Both sides must be fastened and both straps must be fastened and worn over shoulders.
- Students will not wear caps, hats, or bandannas in the school building.
- Students may not wear dark glasses inside the building unless prescribed by a doctor.
- Dress/grooming shall not create a health or other hazard to the safety of the student or others.
- Any item of clothing, hairstyle, or code issue that is a disruption or is deemed inappropriate can be restricted; this includes ripped or torn apparel. This dress code will be enforced on all Lazbuddie ISD property and at all school functions, home and away.
- If dress is inappropriate, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problems at school. If not corrected, disciplinary action will be taken. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action. Appropriate disciplined procedures shall be followed in all cases.
- The principal, in cooperation with the sponsor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity. Students who violate those standards may be removed or excluded from the activity. Students who violate those standards may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the principal or sponsor and may be subject to other disciplinary action.
- The district prohibits pictures, emblems, or writings on clothing that are (1) lewd, offensive, vulgar, or obscene, (2) advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or controlled substances.
- All tattoos are to be covered at all times.
- No holes or frays in jeans will be allowed.
- Prohibited bars, gauges, and rings will be confiscated and require a \$15 return fee.
- ALL students will be required tuck shirt tails in, UNLESS they wear a collared polo shirt that has a straight hem that does not exceed wrist length. Individual teachers reserve the right to request that shirt tails be tucked in.
- Dress Code violators will be required to wear a jumpsuit for the remainder of the school day in which an offense is committed, and will be required to attend one day of Saturday School.
- Students will not be allowed to call parents and have new clothes brought to school.
- The principal will exercise discretion in deciding dress code violations.

## Cafeteria Services

The district participates in the School Breakfast Program and National School Lunch Program and offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. Free and reduced-price meals are available based on financial need. Information about a student’s participation is confidential. See Alicia Pacheco in the student office to apply.

The district follows the federal and state guidelines regarding foods of minimal nutritional value being served or sold on school premises during the school day. [For more information, see policy CO(LEGAL).]

## Food and Drink

- No food or drinks will be allowed in classrooms or lockers, with the exception of bottled water. All other snacks and drinks will be confiscated.
- No food or drinks, including water, will be allowed in computer labs.
- Energy drinks are strictly prohibited at school and at any school activity.
- Breakfast and lunch snacks may not leave the cafeteria at any time.
